

Blue Zone Side Event – Concept Note

"Leading by Doing - Three Years of progress and Meaningful Action Towards 30x30"

Thursday 12 June, 12h15-13h30, Room 4

I. RATIONALE

Three years ago, at UNOC2 in Lisbon, a diverse group of countries and organizations hosted a side event to advance discussions on the challenges and successes of implementing MPAs worldwide. The event highlighted key strategies to secure stakeholders' buy-in, fostering engagement, and ensuring effective long-term management of MPAs.

Three years later, a similar group of partners will reconvene in Nice to assess progress, share lessons learned and present successful models for MPA establishment and management. This event will not only track advancement but also set the stage for bold new commitments. With an eye toward achieving SDG14 and the 30x30 target, participants will announce ambitious actions to expand MPAs, reinforcing global efforts to protect our ocean for future generations.
